 Area, 40,000 Square Miles; or 25,600,000 Acres.
 Population, about 7 to the Square Mile.
 Geological Formation, a few miles of the East end is on Transition Rocks; a few miles of the West end is Alluvial; The whole of the remainder is Secondary.
 Soil, Generally good, producing Cotton, Tobacco, Wheat &c- in great abundance.
 Minerals, Iron, Limestone, Coal, Copperas, Alum, Nitre, Lead &c-
 Face of the Country, Very Picturesque; Eastern part Mountainous; Middle Hilly; Western part undulating.
 Navigation, Very good in the Mississippi, Cumberland and Tennessee Rivers.
