may have seized or disposed of at that  
time.

2<sup>nd</sup> We will and request that our just debts  
be paid out of the proceeds of the  
personal property of which we may die  
seized and disposed at our death.

3<sup>rd</sup> We will and desire, that after our  
death that our Nephew Solomon  
Dickerson, have all the Personal  
property we may die seized and disposed  
of after the expense of binding up  
of our estate by our Executor

4<sup>th</sup> We will and desire to the said  
Solomon Dickerson, all the real  
estate we may die seized and

in the head of Burrows Cove in the  
4<sup>th</sup> Civil District of Grundy County  
including both of the tracts of land  
one on which ~~we~~ live and one  
adjacent thereto to have and to hold  
to the said Sol Dickson his heirs and  
assigns forever.

5<sup>th</sup> We hereby nominate and appoint  
Solomon Dickson as our Executor  
to carry out the provisions of this
