Hans Jacob Stamm, father of Mrs John Kunz (Marie Magdalena Stamm), born August 3, 1848 in Schleitheim, Canton Schaffhausen, Switzerland. Mrs John Kunz wrote on this picture, "My father Jacob Stamm 1878." The picture was taken prior to his marriage to Anna Maria Benkert in 1879 and their immigration to the United States in 1880 . Their marriage license identifies his occupation as helmsman; he was probably a tourist steam boat captain on one of the Swiss lakes. This picture shows him in the uniform of that occupation.

John Kunz made significant contributions to the development of the Swiss colony of Hohenwald; he helped survey the town and farm lots, developed one of the early farms, served as the secretary of the Swiss Pioneer Union (the founding corporation of the colony), wrote promotional articles in the colony newspaper ("The Swiss-American Pioneer"), served as the town's first postmaster and participated in community projects.

Marie Magdalena Stamm, daughter of Hans Jacob Stamm and Anna Maria Benkert-Stamm, was born September 29, 1880 in Hottingen, Switzerland. She immigrated to America with her mother and father when she was seven weeks old. After her father was killed in New York City in 1895, she was sent to live with an Aunt in Switzerland where she attended finishing school and learned dressmaking. This picture was probably taken about 1898 while she was living with her Aunt in Switzerland.

Emil Roth was one of the first members of the Swiss Colony in Hohenwald. John Kunz was close friends of the Roth family; Emil's wife, Elizabeth Weyermann, was a first cousin to John Kunz. Flora Kappeler, cousin to Emil Roth, Married Herman Stamm, brother of Mrs John Kunz. Emil left his family in Hohenwald to work in a freight warehouse for the railroad in Alliance, Ohio, in the late 1890s. His family lived on the John Kunz farm until he later returned to Hohenwald.
