I Jeramiah Walker do make and
publish this as my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking and making void all other
wills by me at any time made, First, I
desire that my funeral expenses, and all my
just debts be paid as soon after my death as
possible out of any moneys that I may die
possessed of or may first come ^{into} the hands of
my Executor or Administrator - Secondly I
give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly
K Walker, Susan and Mal, her daughter, and
their increase & one grey mare, and one
womans saddle, and two beds and furniture
and one Bedstead and Bureau to be hers
forever, and also to have possession of my
Mansion house I now live in, and to be
supported of the proceeds of the place
during her natural life or widowhood
And thirdly I have nothing more to give
my Son Amos Walker, because I have given
him his portion in lands and other property,
and fourthly I have nothing more to give
to the heirs of James H Walker deceased my
Son, for I have given him in his life time
in land and money & other property and
Fifthly I give and bequeath to my
daughter Nancy Bellion the tract of

land at the Big Spring, that she
now is in possession of, and not to be
sold from her without her approbation, and
the reason why I give her no more is,
because I have given her portion in money
and other property, and sixthly I have
nothing more to give to my daughter Martha
McGhee, for I have given her her portion in
a Negro woman & money and other property,
and seventhly, I have nothing more to give
to the heirs of my son John B. Walker deceased
for I have given him his portion in his life time
in land & money & other property, and eighthly
and I give and bequeath to the heirs of
Hannah Killian deceased my daughter
fifty dollars apiece, and the reason I give
no more is, because I give her her portion in
her life time in money and other property, and
ninthly, I give and bequeath to the heirs of
Sarah Lockhart deceased my daughter fifty
dollars apiece, and the reason I give no more is
because I give her her portion in money &
other property in her life time, and tenthly, I
give and bequeath to my son Jeremiah H. Walker
the whole of the tract of land that he now lives
on, but if he dies without any issue the land
to be sold and the money to be equally divided
amongst all my heirs, and the reason I give

him no more is, because I have given him
his portion in money and other property, and
Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my
two sons to wit Francis M. Walker & Isaac E.
Walker all the tract of land I now live on
with two tracts of mountain land adjoining it
to wit, Two hundred and fifty acres be the same
more or less of all of it, except one acre where
the graveyard and meeting house stand is
which I reserve for public use, with all the
property of every description both out of doors
& in the house, with all the money I may have
except that I give to my wife, and except
Two hundred and fifty dollars of this
property to be sold if no money on hand to
pay the heirs of the two daughters above named
deceased, and again except one Bed and
furniture, and one cow to Margaret Walker
that I am now raising when she comes of
age or marry, I give my Negro man Joseph
to Francis M. Walker my son, and I give my
Negro woman Elvira and her increase to
Isaac E. Walker my son, and I give Robert my
Negro man to both of them jointly to take care
of until death, and if one of the boys dies
before they come of age the other to have his
share, Lastly I do hereby nominate and
appoint Polly M. Walker my beloved wife my

Guardian without having to give security
for the two boys until they come of age to
manage their property for them, and also my
executor or Administrator - In witness whereof
I do hereby set to this my Will my hand and
Seal, this the 25th day of October 1857.
