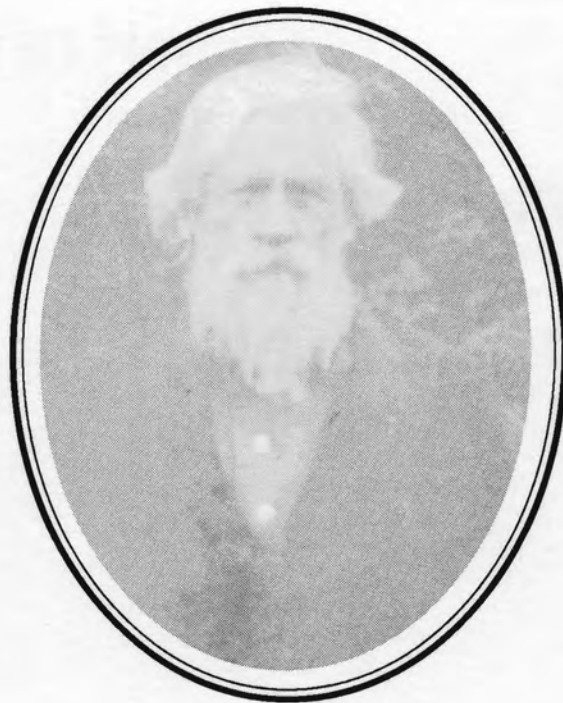

Introduction

Isn't it funny how a child's school assignment can change your life?

In the sixty-four years (four children, sixteen years each) that our children attended school, I have done or helped to do many things. We have found bugs in the middle of the night for insect displays. In the spring, we have searched the woods for wild flowers, when it was too early for wild flowers to appear, because, "We have to have them." In summer, we have caught butterflies, because, "That will be an assignment when school starts in the fall." In fall, we have spent our Sunday afternoons searching for leaves, because "I want to have more than anyone else."

It was such an assignment as this, that has prompted me to write this book. In school, the children were asked to make a genealogy chart; thus the fire was kindled and as years passed, it has continued to burn very brightly.

This book contains the descendants of Anderson Winton, who was my husband's Great-grandfather.

All information is not documented, but is information told to descendants by their parents.

I have visited many people, corresponded with people from many states, visited cemeteries, studied old Bibles, visited courthouses and perused libraries.

Most people I have contacted have been very helpful and fast to reply to my requests. For this, I will be ever grateful.

I have done my best, but I am sure there are some errors. For this I apologize. There are some things that are omitted, because I was unable to obtain the information. I had hoped to have information on all the descendants, but were I have failed, all avenues of approach were exhausted.

Along the way, I have inserted tidbits of information that is amusing and I hope it will be of interest to those who read it.

William Winton was an imigrant from Ireland. Tradition has it, that he met his wife Betsey on the boat coming to America. They lived in Pennsylvania and Virginia before settling in Tennessee. This is proven by the birth of children in both Pennsylvania and Virginia. He was recorded in both the 1750 and 1760 census.

William and Betsey had eight children:

1. John, born November 8, 1761 in Virginia, died August 2, 1846 in Lenoir City, Tennessee. He married Arabella Cunningham on May 15, 1784 in Woodstock Shenandoah County, Virginia. He was a farmer, Methodist minister and successful financier. He settled in Muddy Creek Station before 1785. They had 13 children.
2. McClellon, born 1765. He went to Morgan County, Alabama.
3. Margaret Winton born 1767- married James M. Dunn November 20, 1785 in Greene County, Tennessee.
4. William married Catherine Denton on June 19, 1796 in Jefferson County, Tennessee. He died in 1813 in Rhea County, Tennessee.
5. Robert was born 1777 in Pennsylvania. He married someone named Elizabeth who was born in 1787. He died in Overton County, Tennessee before 1860.
6. Stephen was born November 7, 1779 in Pennsylvania. He married Rhonda _____ who was born March 26, 1785. He died March 31, 1856 and she died September 13, 1856. They had nine children. On November 14, 1814 he was drafted. He was honorably discharged May 18, 1815 in Sevierville, Tennessee. He was a Justice of the Peace, Overseer of Roads and Coroner. They were buried at Bostic Farms, Meigs County, Tennessee.
7. James was born in 1781. He migrated to Warren County, Tennessee. He married a woman he called Suky. He obtained 216 acres of land by Land Grant in Warren County on Hickory Creek. John Sevier was governor at the time. He, also, bought 118 acreas of land for \$500 from William T. Lewis. He apparently had 5 children. He died in 1833.
8. George was born in 1782 in Virginia. He married Catherine Shults/Shultz. He migrated to Polk County, Arkansas.

James I, son of William, as stated before, lived in Warren County, Tennessee on Hickory Creek. He made his will on July 18, 1826. He apparently died in late 1833 for his will was probated January 7, 1834. At Suky's death his property was to be divided between his sons: Stephen, John, and James, also, Jesse Wooten. James Burress and wife were to receive \$5 only. Although, I can't prove it. Apparently Jesse Wooten and James Burress were his sons-in-law.

James II, father of Anderson, was born 1801 and died August 16, 1896 at the home of his son John. He was 95 years old. He was buried in Wesley's Chapel Cemetary according to accounts in the paper, but I have been unable to find a stone there.

He was a farmer and apparently a "man about town". I have been able to verify four wives. His first wife was a Johnson, said to be a relative to President Andrew Johnson. They had seven children.

1. John born in 1826 and married Mary Emmaline Crouch, who was the first person buried in Wesley's Chapel Cemetery. She does not have a stone with her name, but for years her grave had a small paling fence around it. As far as I know they only had one child, William who married Nancy Wooten. William had 6 children: Sarah, Martha, Stephen P., Samuel, Jesse who married Lucy E. Griswold and Mary Bell who married M.W. C. (Charlie) Carden.

2. Stephen was born in 1829 and died in 1886. He married Mary Elizabeth Cunningham. They had 7 children. Sarah who married Bo Wooten, Joanna who married John Bryant, Jennie Lee who married Houston Brawley, Jeston who married Bob Brawley, Thursa who married Jesse Winton, Mark (1876-1894) who married Mary Elizabeth ? and Stephen who never married.

3. Anderson, born December 27, 1830, married Mary Ann Messick. They had 9 children. Since this book is about his ancestors, I will tell more about them later.

4. James Richard who married (Anny or Amy) Warren on May 23, 1858.

5. Nancy born 1834 and married Jonathan Douglas on February 22, 1851.

6. Jesse born 1836 and married Carolyn Northcutt. They had 10 children:

7. Mary born 1838 married James Rhea. They had 8 children: Jessie, John, Will, Mack, Mary Chester, who married Joe Lusk, Josie -M- Bill Bynum, Cleo -M- Tobe Lusk, and Lizzie married a Cunningham.

James II's wife, the Johnson, died of a heart attack, according to two of his great grandchildren, Leonard Winton and Mary Sue Winton Phipps. According to the 1850 census, before August 24; that year, he married a girl named Malinda who was 23 years old. I have not been able to find a death or divorce of her, but Leonard Winton told me, that one of his wives was killed in a tornado in Hubbards Cove. His son Stephen, also married in 1850 and was still living in the household at the time of the census.

In 1844 an election was held concerning making a new county (Grundy). One of these elections was held at the house of James Winton on July 1, 1855.

James II married Elizabeth Hawk Purcell, widow of Ed Purcell. She had two daughters; Luticia Jane and Mary.

On April 16, 1873 he asked for and obtained a divorce from her by proving she was guilty of "adultry and elopement with a Mr. Adams".

He had 3 daughters by her:

Fannie who married James Reed

Delphia who married Elzberry Wooton

Martha who married James Crownover

In his will he left his house and 2 acres of land around it to Elizabeth Adams, widow of B.H. Adams, during her widowhood." At her death or *absence*, it was to go to his daughter, Fannie. This authenticates the story told me by Leonard Winton. He said, "She left him and married another man when her husband died, she came back and James (sometimes called Juber) told her he would never marry the same woman twice, but if she wanted to live there, she could."

On October 22, 1888 he married Mrs. Sarah (Sally) Myers.

In May 1893, his son John, tried to prove him insane, but failed to do so. He died at the home of John on August 16, 1896 at the age of 95.

Anderson, whose descendents are here recorded was born on December 27, 1830. He met and married Mary Ann Messick. They were married by Justice of the Peace, William McGraw, on August 22, 1852. She was six months older than him being born on June 28, 1830. She was the daughter of George and Dorcus Guest Messick.

Anderson and Mary Ann had nine children. Four girls were born before they had a son, John Lewis Anderson. Apparently, when John was very young, Anderson had to go fight in the Civil War. A small scrap of paper was found in the family Bible which said, "Anderson Winton got home May the 17 the year 1865". After his return from war, four more children were born, two boys and two girls.

Another document found in the Bible was a certificate stating that Anderson was moving his membership from the Methodist, Episcopal Church, South, Hillsboro Circuit, Tennessee Conference. The certificate was dated October 1, 1887, but it did not tell where he was moving his membership.

I hope these tid bits of information will be of interest to those who read this book.

Anderson was married three times, but only had children by Mary Ann. She died on June 21, 1887. She was blind for ten years before her death. His second marriage was to a woman whose name was Maggie Foster. This marriage only lasted a short time. They married in Coffee County on November 27, 1887. On December 4, 1889, he married Susan A. Mankins, in Coffee County. Rev. J.W. Gilbert performed the ceremony. Anderson died on July 21, 1906. Both he and Mary Ann are buried in the Winton Cemetery in Burrows Cove.

I. Sarah Catherine Winton

I. Sarah Catherine never married and only lived to be twenty-one years of age. She died March 28, 1874.

This information was obtained from the family Bible, but I do not know where she was buried. I was unable to find a stone in any of the likely places.

There are some unmarked stones in the Winton Cemetery, one of which is probably hers.

II. Darcus Emmaline Winton

Darcus (Darkie) was a strong willed, hard working person. She was very open, and if she liked you she would do anything in the world for you. If she disliked you, she never tried to hide the fact from you.

She loved to tell jokes and would laugh until she cried when telling or hearing a good joke. She especially liked to joke with her sons.

She married Silas Ruben (Pete) Crabtree, who was born February 13, 1848. After their marriage, they lived in Hawk Holler near Pelham. In later years, they lived in Coalmont, Tennessee.

Uncle Pete died on June 18, 1913, and she lived until May 7, 1930.

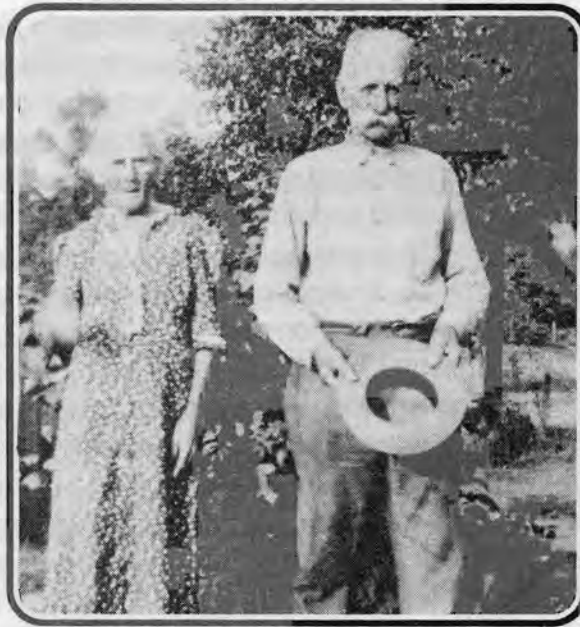

V. JOHN LEWIS ANDERSON WINTON

John, the oldest boy, was a farmer and a horse trader. Politically he was a democrat and by religious belief, a Nazerine. Before he moved to Coalmont from Pelham, he attended the Chapman Chapel Nazerene Church in the Cross-Roads community.

He was always known for his honesty and truthfulness. He was a good story teller, and I can remember how interested I was in the tales he told—all grandchildren would quietly listen. Too bad my yen for ancestral knowledge was not kindled at the time, for he could have furnished much more information.

Granddaddy had a handlebar mustache; all the grandchildren were awed when he ate and drank. Once again a mustache is in fashion, and when I look at my son, Steve, I sometimes wonder how he and Granddaddy would have looked side by side.

In 1888, he married Nancy Emmaline Crabtree, daughter of Iley and Mary C. Tucker Crabtree. The ceremony was performed by Justice of the Peace, William Winton. This was probably a relative, but I do not know for sure. Nan, as she was called, was born on December 12, 1864.

Nan was a hard worker and an early riser. She called you only once for meals. I can almost taste her stewed potatoes and corn pones, it was so very good. She doctored the sick with home remedies and assisted in the delivery of many babies. Granny was known for her quick wit and sage sayings.

When my husband, Lewie, and I were married, we went to see Granny and Granddaddy. Lewie told them that we were married, and Granny said, "I was twenty-four when we married." Lewie, who inherited much of her wit, answered, "Granny, you waited five years too long." Another thing that I remember was when our oldest daughter was born, Lewie told Granny that we had named her Patricia Adalyn, Granny asked, "Is she still alive?" When we first visited them with the new baby, Granddaddy looked at her and said, "That is the prettiest baby I ever saw." Granny looked at him and said, "Gentlemen, John, you never looked at one before." Some of

Granny's sayings will never be forgotten and will be carried on in our family for generations to come. Some of them are as follows: When school buses started stopping at every house Granny would say, "I had to walk several miles to school. In the fall when frost was on the ground, I would be barefooted. I would run through the frost, squat and warm my feet, and rise and run again." A friend told me that a young widow was grieving and it seemed she would never stop. Some of the relatives asked Granny what should they do to help her. Her reply was, "Do nothing. A lowing cow soon forgets her calf." She was right, before long the lady had married again. But the thing that I remember most was this: Every time a young couple would marry, Granny would say, "Poor little things, they ain't seed the monkey."

On one occasion, when Granny had gone to be with a sick friend, Granddaddy was hungry and decided to cook him some rice. He poured out what he thought he could eat into an old iron teakettle and filled it with water and hung it over the fire. Soon the pot began to boil and the rice to swell. The next thing he knew, rice was boiling out the spout of the teakettle. He grabbed a pan to catch the rice, but it was soon full and he had to get another. In telling the story he would say, "Before it was through, every bum pan in the house was full."

Once Granddaddy traded cows with an old woman, and in a few days she sent word for him to come to see her. He, my father-in-law, Claude and my husband, Lewie, went to see her. She came out of the house with her hands rolled up in an apron. She said she was not satisfied with the cow and after some dickering, another trade was made. When they drove off, Lewie said, "Granddaddy, I hear tell she carries a gun in that apron. What would you have done, if she had pulled a gun on you?" Granddaddy answered, "I would have slapped both eyes into one and then punched it out."

John and Nan lived in Pelham from their marriage until 1923, when they moved to Coalmont.

He liked to visit his sons in Pelham and would go to see Claude and his family quite often. On one such visit, he needed to go to see someone and he asked if Glen could drive him. At that time Glen was only about ten years old, but could drive reasonably well. Glen was given permission to drive, but he was not to cross highway 41, which was the main road at that time. When they got there, Granddaddy thought Glen was doing such a good job, that he told him to go on. He came out on the road and hit a car, the hub cap flew off and went rolling down the highway. Granddaddy said, "Listen to that bum racket."

Granny and Granddaddy lived in Coalmont until their deaths. Granddaddy lived until August 4, 1946. He died at Emerald-Hodgson Hospital in Sewanee, Tennessee. Granny lived on until November 16, 1958. She died at home.

These are a few things that I remember and cherish, and I am glad to pass them on for future generations.

Lewie and Inez Winton

I was born May 6, 1926 and am the daughter of Abbott and Gladys Conry Carden. Lewie Winton and I, Sarah Inez Carden were married on June 17, 1944. It was near the end of World War II. Lewie had been rejected for service, because of a stiff elbow, which he received in elementary school. Lewie was working in a defense plant in Cleveland, Ohio. He got emergency leave from work, when his cousin was killed in a plane crash. We went to Rossville, Georgia and were married, because there was no waiting period there. This was the situation in wartime, you did not have time for waiting periods which Tennessee required.

We were married on Saturday night and left for Cleveland, Ohio, by Greyhound bus on Monday morning. At that time, gasoline and tires were rationed, so not many people drove cars, especially for long distances.

Housing was hard to find, and Lewie only had an efficiency room for us. We cooked, ate, slept and lived in the same room. There was an ice box in the hall and we shared the bath with other people in the house. This was not very satisfactory, but we "made do" until I invited a friend to visit. The landlady told me quick and fast "No Visitors Allowed." The next day we started looking for a place to live. We found a 3 room furnished apartment in a not very desirable looking place, but we moved in anyway. When we turned out the light to go to sleep, we were attacked by bed bugs. We shook out our few possessions and spent the night in someone's car. (We don't know who it belonged to.)

The next day we started looking for housing again. A friend of ours let us sleep in their living room until we could find something desirable.

After a few days, we found an apartment on the 3rd floor. It was clean and very much to our liking. The Lockwoods, owners of the house, treated us like we were their children. When she wanted to visit with me, she would beat on the pipes and I would go to the first floor. The fire escape went out our kitchen window, and one day when Mr. Lockwood was repairing a gutter, he saw cornbread on the table. He asked what it was and said he had never tasted any. I fixed him a piece with butter. From then on, he came to do all repairs at dinner time.

It was in the Lockwood house that I learned about keeping house and preparing meals without supervision. This was also the place I heard that our beloved President Franklin D. Roosevelt had died. We were living here for our first Christmas.

Lewie's uncle lived in Detroit, Michigan and invited us to spend the holiday with him. We went down town on Christmas Eve to get a bus or train. We stayed until very late and were unable to get transportation. We returned home, knowing full well, that we had no food for Christmas dinner. We had a can of pork and beans and old bread. In the afternoon it started snowing, but stores were all closed so we couldn't get milk for snow cream. Then, we found we were in luck. Our neighbors downstairs on the second floor weren't home and the milk man had delivered them a quart of milk. We got brave and helped ourselves. I made snow cream and we sat down to enjoy. That's what you get for taking something that isn't yours. I used salt instead of sugar and the whole thing was ruined. To make matters worse, our neighbors came home and brought their grandchildren and they cried for milk. Thus, ended our first Christmas.

In the spring we moved into an apartment nearer to Lewie's work. This couple, the Wilmot's, also, took us under their wings. Lewie worked long hours and seven days a week, so I joined them on rides and sometime meals. Once they took me to a restaurant for "southern fried chicken." When I tasted it, I told them it didn't even resemble "southern fried chicken," so I was invited to cook for them. After the first chicken dinner, there were many more.

While we lived with the Wilmots, World War II ended. I will never forget the whistles, bells, horns and all the shouts and laughter. It was wonderful.

After the end of the war, Lewie was laid off and we were expecting our first child. We returned to Tennessee and Lewie went to work with his Dad at a sawmill. We lived with his parents for a few months and money was scarce. I remember, I took the last \$10 we had to order two dozen diapers and outing for baby clothes. I put it in the mail box for the rural carrier. Later I saw a bird fly away with the bill. No baby clothes but the bird had an expensive nest.

While we lived in Burroughs Cove, we attended Bethel Methodist Church. This was Lewie's boyhood church. Our daughter Patricia Adalyn (Pat) was born on December 5, 1945. She was surrounded by love and attention. Besides Lewie and I, she had 4 grandparents, 4 great grandparents and 5 uncles all ready to answer her every need. She also had a great aunt that thought there was no other child.

Since my mother was an invalid, and my grandfather was deceased, we moved into my family home in January 1946. Lewie took over the farm and I took over running the house as well as caring for my mother. My grandmother and aunt were all too happy to care for the baby. To say the least, she never wanted for anything.

While living here and other times when we lived near Pelham, we attended Pelham Methodist Church. This was my childhood church.

Lewie worked long hours in the fields. We had no electricity or running water so I spent much of my time carrying water and washing on a rub board. We raised a big garden and we canned most everything.

When Pat was 19 months old my aunt died at age 39. Ten days later my mother died at age 49. This was one of the hardest times of my life.

On Pat's second birthday my grandmother sold the farm and we were out of a job and out of a home.

Lewie decided to go back to Cleveland, Ohio to hunt for work. Pat and I stayed with his parents until he could find work and a place for us to live.

We had temporary housing for a short time. We then moved back to the apartment in the Lockwood house where we had lived early in our marriage. We were very happy here and, again, the Lockwoods treated us like family. Pat was their pet.

One hot summer day, I had supper almost finished and I asked Lewie to go down the block to get ice cream for dessert. I told him to send Pat upstairs to get washed up. In a few minutes I heard her crying. I asked what was wrong and she said, "Daddy spanked me." By that time she was at the top of the stairs without a stitch of clothes on. Lewie had found her going down the street like that. She said she was hot so she took her clothes off. She hid them behind the garage.

Lewie's brother, Paul, was also living in Cleveland. When his wife went to the hospital on December 12, 1948 to have their first child they were informed that they could not bring a baby to their apartment. We spent days trying to find housing for them, but to no avail. We finally agreed to share a house with them.

A short time after we moved here — on December 30, 1948, our second daughter, Vetron Kay was born.

In late July Lewie and Paul were laid off and once again we returned to Tennessee.

We found a small house (really a shack) to rent. We could get a good house in January, so we decided to "make do." There were no door knobs on the doors, only wooden buttons and latches. The back of the house sat on the ground and there was a high porch in front. One hot day Vetron was playing in a tub of water on the porch when a sudden summer storm came up. There was lightning and thunder and Vetron started screaming. I thought the noise had scared her, but the next day she was sore to touch. We took her to the doctor and it was determined that the lightning had shocked her.

Lewie was working for his Dad at the sawmill and money was again very scarce. We were expecting a baby in March. My aunt made us a fruit cake for Christmas and a few days before Christmas we went shopping for the girls. When we returned we found that a hog had rooted down the back door and had eaten the fruitcake.

January, 1950 things looked better. Lewie took over the operation of a service station in Pelham and we moved to a good house. We visited both of my grandmothers often and ran errands for Lewie. We took Mama Carden and her two sisters for doctor's appointments and on shopping trips. We always visited Mama Conry after church on Sunday.

On March 22, 1950, our third daughter, Karen Ann, was born. One of the men who came to the station daily, was surprised when he was told Lewie had a new daughter. He said, "I know that is not true, for I saw Inez yesterday and she wasn't pregnant." Boy, was he wrong. We had a 4 year old, a fifteen month old and a new baby.

Lewie worked from 6 a.m. till 10 p.m. I took his meals. One night, the children were all asleep and I left them to go the 1 1/2 miles to pick him up. There was always a bunch of men sitting around talking and were not in any hurry to leave. When they discovered I had left the children, they scattered fast. After that, I would hide the girls in the floor board so they would think the children were home. This way the men would leave and Lewie could go home.

Mama Carden lived across the street from the station and she liked for the children to come and they liked to go there. My cousin, Cleora Gallagher, was often there with her children and they enjoyed each other. Mama Carden was especially fond of Karen and Cleora's Bobby.

The day Patricia and Cleora's Tressie Jo started to school, we left Karen and Bobby there. I had forgotten to bring Karen a bottle. When we came from school both babies were asleep. She had given Bobby enough milk to go to sleep and then gave Karen the rest of his bottle.

One day Vetron was sitting on the porch holding her doll. I asked what she was doing and she told me she was waiting to see the doctor because her baby was sick. Later I saw her in the yard and asked what the doctor told her. She said, "It was just magination."

The girls loved to visit Mama Conry and Aunt Marjorie Burnett. They each spent some time there each year. This was their special vacation.

On June 1, 1953, Lewie started working as deputy sheriff. He was gone most all the time.

One June 30, Lewie's brother, Paul, was killed in a sawmill accident.



In August, Pat started her third year of school at James K. Shook School. My mother had also attended this school. We had not yet moved to Tracy City but had a house to move into in a couple of weeks. I took her to school for a couple of days, till she could learn what bus to ride. She missed it one day and they had to call Lewie to come get her. All our children attended this school.

By the end of August we had moved to Tracy. At that time the county offices, courthouse and jail were in a building where City Hall is now. We lived across the street from Baggenstoss Bakery. The children would go to the bakery and get broken cake (it was 10¢ per pound) and I would make chocolate sauce. They enjoyed it very much.

Mrs. Mable Metcalfe owned the house we lived in. She was a sweet, very prim lady. After Karen was grown, she told of climbing a tree and Mrs. Mable telling her, "Get out of my tree." Karen answered, "It's mine while I am in it."

We attended the First United Methodist Church and still do.

In April of 1954 Lewie had to have back surgery and we were expecting our fourth child. We had not told the children we were expecting. One day Mrs. Mable told me she understood congratulations were in order. I asked what she was talking about. She said, "Karen said you were getting a baby

brother and you were going to name him Sugar John." I don't know what possessed her to tell that, but she still calls him John part of the time. Vetron started to school in August and on October 30th our son, Steven Paul was born.

In 1955 Karen started to school and in December we moved to Royal Oak, Michigan. One day we went to visit Lewie's brother and the children were out playing. We had taught Steve his address and phone number, but we were in another township. I discovered Steve was missing. I was frantic and then I saw a police car, slowly cruising on another street, I ran to it, Steve and I were really happy to see each other.

On Thanksgiving 1956, we went to visit my father in Pennsylvania. The children enjoyed all the historical sites in Philadelphia.

My brother, Billy and his family joined us for Thanksgiving Dinner.

There was a bad snowstorm the day we left and the interstate was closed for a while. We stopped several places before we could get food. We were finally told they had doughnuts but they were not glazed yet. We bought 2 dozen and thought we had a banquet.

In November 1957 Lewie's mother died.

In January, 1958, we moved back to Pelham, TN. The girls finished that year's school in Pelham.

In late June we bought a house in Tracy. Before we moved Pat went away to camp for a week. She was to come home about 2 p.m. on Saturday. We had a friend from Michigan who was in Tennessee with a moving van. He offered to move us to Tracy and we took him up on the deal. I had planned to be in Pelham when Pat got home from camp but she came before noon. It must have been terrible for her, to come home and find her family had moved away. The man who brought her from camp brought her on to Tracy but it will always be a black memory for me. It was one of those things that happens in life that should not have happened, but did.

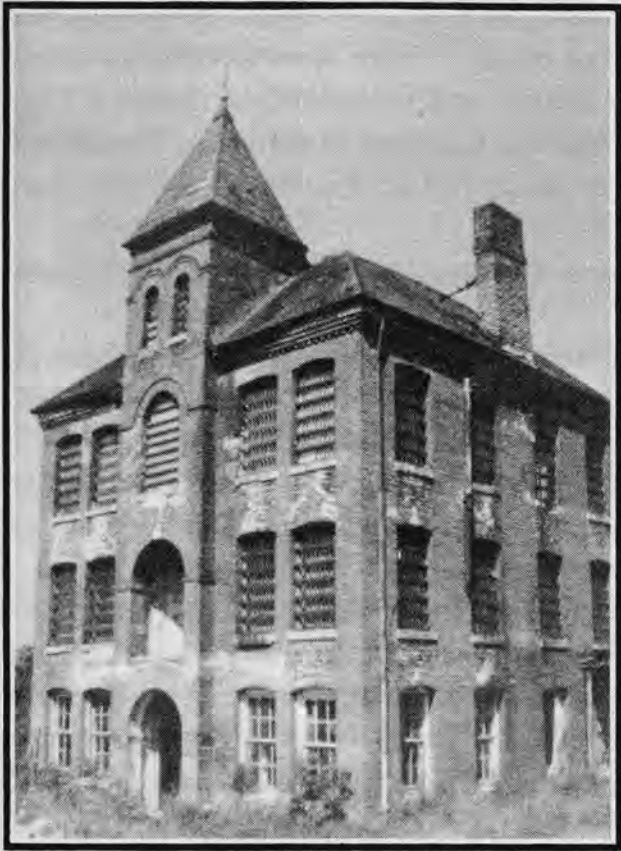
In 1959 Steve started to school. After a few days, he asked his teacher, Mrs. Eula Partin, if he could talk to her. She told him to come up to her desk. He said, "When are you going to tell me something I don't know. I thought I came to school to learn." She told me she hardly knew how to answer, but Steve soon learned there was a lot he did not know.

The children were always active in 4-H. The girls won prizes in sewing and cooking, as well as other things. Steve had calves. One year he had a calf well-trained to enter in the Fair. The night before the

contest, his calf got out and got run over. Lewie went to a neighbor and borrowed a calf. They put a halter on it and lead it behind the truck. It was so tired, it lead well at the Fair and he took first place.

I started to work for Selective Service in 1962.

In 1963 Pat finished high school. She had two great-grandmothers who attended. My Grandmother Conry died this summer. Pat entered the University of Tennessee at Knoxville in the fall and my father died in December.

In 1964 Lewie was elected Sheriff. At this time, the Sheriff's office and jail were in Altamont. The building was an old 3 story brick structure. Our jailer was a retired railroader with one leg. His wife was the cook. Lewie had to furnish his own car and only had two deputies. He worked night and day. We did not have one minute we could call our own.

In 1964, we remodeled our house from roof to floor, and added a big screened-in back porch, which we enjoyed very much.

In 1965, Pat married Carl Wayne Goodman and they moved to Georgia. She entered Berry College.

In 1966, Vetron finished high school, and in the fall entered Tennessee Technological University in Cookeville. Lewie's dad died this year, as did my Grandmother Carden.

Lewie's office kept us all busy. Our house became headquarters for law enforcement in the area. I never knew how many I would have to cook for. We had the deputies, the State Troopers, the T.B.I., the district attor-

neys and even the F.B.I.

Lewie would call home at 2 or 3 a.m. and say they needed breakfast. I would get up and cook — always making biscuits and all the other things. Sometimes I'd have as many as 12 or 15. This became our life.

Lewie was always active in the Tennessee Sheriff's Association, and an avid sponsor of the Sheriff's Youth Town in Jackson, Tennessee. Youth Town consisted of four cottages, each housing 10 to 12 boys and the house parents. The Sheriff's Association had a big Christmas party for them each year. One year, with the help of my daughters, I embroidered blue denim shirts for each boy. Most of these boys were from homes where their parents were incarcerated.

In 1967, Lewie was Worshipful Master of Felix Grundy Lodge No. 284 A & FM in Pelham, Tennessee. The same year, he was Worthy Patron and Inez was Worthy Matron of Tracy City Chapter No. 266, Order of The Eastern Star in Tracy City, Tennessee.

In the spring of 1968, we had one very busy week. In two days time, Steve finished the 8th grade at Shook, Karen finished Grundy County High School and Pat got her B.S. degree from Berry College. That fall Karen entered the University of Tennessee at Knoxville.

In 1969 Pat and Carl went to Italy for three years.

In 1970 Vetron finished college at Tennessee Tech. in Cookeville. In December of 1970, she married Mark Sanders Mochow.

Through all of Steve's high school and college years, Steve worked at John W. Greeter Building Center. He worked weekends during school and full time during the summers.

In 1972 Steve finished Grundy County High School and entered MTSU in Murfreesboro. This same year Karen went to work for the F.B.I. in Washington, D.C.

In 1972, I started working both Marion and Grundy County as Executive Secretary for Selective Service. After working both counties for two years, both offices closed. I, then, went to Winchester and was Executive Secretary for six counties. Selective Service System was phased out in 1976.

In September 1974, our grandson, Matthew Forrest Mochow was born in Maryville, Tennessee.

In the summer of 1976 Steve went to the Holy Land on an archaeological dig. While there, they visited Egypt and other places of interest.

In January 1977 Steve graduated from MTSU and was employed full-time at John W. Greeter Building Center.

In June 1977 Steve and Peggy Darlene Green were married. They lived in my Carden grandparents' house in Pelham until they bought a house in Tracy City.

Several things happened in Lewie's years as sheriff are worthy of mention.

In 1967 Lewie arrested a man for public drunkenness and carrying a pistol. He was not a local man and he gave his name as Charles Edward Ray. When Martin Luther King was assassinated by James Earl Ray, we realized this was the man Lewie had had in jail back in 1967.

Harry Templeton was District Attorney at this time. Before court, he would always spend time with Lewie discussing cases and would talk to people involved in a case. On one occasion, Lewie had two young men charged for one offense, but had only been able to arrest one of them. He had been in jail about 45 days and was scared to death. It was near court time and he asked Lewie what was going to happen if he didn't catch the other boy. Lewie lead him to believe all the responsibility would be on him. He convinced Lewie if he would let him go, he would be back in 1 1/2 hours with the other boy. A few minutes after the boy left, in walked the district attorney. He really carried Lewie high about how he would explain to the judge that the boy was in jail, he didn't make bond and he didn't break jail, but he was gone. About five minutes before his time was up, the boy walked in with his partner in crime. The district attorney said that beat anything he had ever seen. Lewie told him, he just didn't have enough faith.

There was lots of car stealing and stripping at this time which kept the sheriff's office busy.

One night, Lewie's brother, J.L. was attending a basketball game at Coalmont School. He went out to check and his car was gone. He immediately called Lewie. Lewie called or went to see all the "local yokels" and told them the car had *better not* be stripped. They all denied stealing it, but it was found unharmed.

Another time, Lewie found a car that was being stripped. He apparently was so close to them that they ran off and left their tools. He called a wrecker and put the tools in the trunk of the car to take to the jail later. There was a fan belt laying there too so he threw it in the trunk also. The next day his fan belt broke. He stopped to see what the trouble was and some of "the boys" stopped and asked if they could help. Lewie told them there was a fan belt and tools in the trunk. They fixed the car, using their own tools. They grinned all the time knowing that Lewie suspected them, but couldn't prove it.

I guess the worst thing that happened while Lewie was sheriff was a triple murder in downtown Tracy City in August 1973. A man killed his ex-girlfriend's husband, her sister and brother-in-law and badly wounded her. He took their child which was in the car and fled the scene. In January, 1974 he was captured in Charlotte, North Carolina after a shoot-out with the FBI. In August, 1974 he was found guilty of 3 counts of murder and one count of assault.

In 1975 Lewie was voted Sheriff of the Year. This year he, also, served as President of the Tennessee Sheriff's Association.

On August 31, 1976, Lewie's years of law enforcement ended.

When Pat and Carl returned from Italy, they went to UT at Knoxville to get their masters' degrees. They were then employed at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Virginia.

Pat was very active in ERA from 1976 to 1982. She was divorced in 1980. From 1982 to 1985, she was very active in the Democratic Party and was a delegate to the National Convention in 1984 in Los Angeles.

In 1980, Steve and Peggy's son, James, was stillborn. In 1981 Mary Cameron was born.

In January, 1982, Vetron's family were sent to Panama, since Mark was in the Army. They were there 3 years.

On January 27, 1982 our house burned. It was a traumatic time, but I know God was with us. Had the doorbell not sounded when the wires burned in two, we probably would have not survived. Steve and Peggy had built a new house, so we lived in his old one until our new house was completed in September, 1982.

In December 1982 Steve entered the ministry in Florida. He served two Methodist churches — one at Cottage Hills, Florida and one in Clear Springs, Alabama.

In 1986 he entered seminary at Asbury College in Lexington, Kentucky. He also served a small church in Centerville, Kentucky while he attended school.

In May 1989 Katherine Alis was born in Lexington, Kentucky. In December of that year Steve finished school and moved to Pensacola, Florida to be associate pastor of Gadsen Street United Methodist Church. In June 1991 he was ordained an Elder of the Methodist Church at Annual Conference in Montgomery, Alabama.

Karen worked for the FBI for five years. She did not like city life, so she moved to Taos, New Mexico. She had her own business there for a while. She also managed two theaters. In February 1989, she married Horace Lynn Kurz. They moved to Freedom, Oklahoma, where they bought a home. He works for a bank there and she will enter school in August to become a LPN.

Vetron and Mark have lived in seven states, as well as Panama since their marriage. She has worked each place. She has taught in different capacities, has managed Day Care Centers and worked for a radio station. She is now employed for Southern Bell. Mark will be retiring from the Army next year and Matt will enter college. They plan to settle near Orlando, Florida.

Pat now works in the Washington, D.C. area as a writer.

Lewie and I are now retired. We spend our time doing the things we want to do. We enjoy our screened-in porch, listening to the birds sing and looking at our flowers.

We like to fish and we camp a lot. We keep our camper stocked with food so we can leave when the notion strikes us. We also like big league baseball.

We enjoy our children, our grandchildren, our community and our church.

I pray that God will give us good health and many more years together.
